Chair Summary

It has been an absolute pleasure for the Abbots Leigh Civic Society to host many memorable events over the past year.

A new addition to the calendar this year was the Civic Society joining forces with the Abbots Leigh Cricket Club to co-host the village/club cricket match. It was a lovely, fun afternoon and therefore we are repeating it this year. The tennis tournament was again kindly hosted and arranged by Mark and Alex Woodington, with assistance from the Civic Society. A great afternoon was had by all who attended.

The Summer drinks event, usually held at Abbots Leigh Nursing Home curtesy of the Gillespie's, was sadly cancelled this year due to lack of ticket sales.

Unfortunately, due to the great British weather, the Festival in the Field became the Festival in the Pub - but we put on a great event under the circumstances and received much positive feedback. This year the Festival in the Field will be in June, to spread out the big events and the work involved.

The children's summer event at Abbots Pool (run by the Abbots Leigh Wildlife Group and supported by the Civic Society) was another success, with a kestrel display, snail racing, pond dipping and model boat racing. The plan is to run this event in alternate years, with the next event in 2026.

In April a fantastic evening was had in the Village Hall with the Quiz Night in aid of Pill Food Bank. Many volunteers outside of the Civic Society were involved with this entertaining evening, the Civic Society were delighted to donate the liquid refreshments to help with increasing the donation to this great cause.

Bonfire Night was a huge success. Many people said the fireworks were the best yet and both the hot dog stand and the hot cider stall were a sell-out. This event in particular requires a huge amount of work from the committee and other volunteers, so well done on all your hard work.

To end the year on a high the Children's Christmas Party was organised by a new team of helpers (with input from the old team) and funded by the Civic Society. As ever, the younger residents in the village had a fun afternoon.

The Civic Society has struggled this year to secure enough volunteers for the setting up and running of the two big events. The recruitment drive in November has brought some great results, but we can always do with more help! Please let us know if you can spare some time to help run these events, which really do help create our community.

On the back of the recent recruitment drive the Civic Society is delighted to announce that Rosie Gloyns, Eleni Franklin, and Andrew Manasseh have joined the Committee. Many of you may know Rosie and her family as she has lived in Abbots Leigh for many years, and has played a very active role in other local interest groups within the village. Eleni, mother of five, moved to the village in 2022 and somehow finds time to be a keen runner and gym goer, as well as enjoying the outdoors life! Since moving to the village Andrew has been actively involved in many village activities and has lots of ideas on how the Civic Society can play even more of an active role in the village and is keen to progress with projects which will enhance village life. The Civic Society has decided to adopt a new structure for organising the events this year. We will fully host and coordinate two main events going forwards.

• The Festival in the Field Sunday 8th June (moved from Sept to spread out the events)

Bonfire Night Wednesday 5th November

For other events going forwards the Civic Society will co-finance and/or help with logistics, with the events being hosted by different village interest groups. Smaller working groups will do most of the organisation. This approach has been tested over the past few months and has worked incredibly well. The Abbots Leigh Cricket Match, the Children's Christmas Party, and the Quiz Night all followed this formula. They were ultimately organised by groups of villagers outside of the Civic Society, but with finance and support from one or two Civic Society committee members where required. This new approach is a model we are going to continue as it has been proven to work and broadens the range and number of events in the village. Review of events held in the previous year

Abbots Leigh Tennis Tournament - Saturday 3rd August 2024

Abbots Leigh Children's Christmas Party – Sunday 8th December 2024

The Abbots Leigh Children's Christmas Party took place on 8th December, and this year was arranged and hosted by a new team of village volunteers, on behalf of the Civic Society. This team of volunteers all gave their time and effort, to ensure this was a wonderful Christmas party for the children of the village, and yet another great event on the village social calendar. Treasurer's Report

Although we had several events which were cancelled, the overall financial position of the Civic Society has improved, with the balance held across the accounts increasing from £8,287.04 (Dec 2023) to £8,998.38 (Dec 2024). The Quiz Night was a great success, raising £1,250 for the Pill Food Bank. We donated £200 to the Abbots Leigh Wildlife Group for their event, and £150 to the Cricket Club for the village match, and a further £824 to the Parish Council for the Old School Field. Finally, we purchased new gazebos for future events. I am stepping back from my role as treasurer, I hope that the village continues to support the Society and, with the help of the new Treasurer, Neil Hopkinson, that the Society goes from strength to strength.

Old School Field Pathway

During 2024 the Civic Society worked with the Parish Council to install a new footpath from the five-bar gate to the lower open green space. The Parish Council have undertaken the construction of the first phase, which terminates at the swings. The Civic Society will consider the possibilities of completing the project after the 2025 Festival in the Field and will make recommendations to the Parish Council. At the present time completion of the extended pathway for disabled access and young children remains a Civic Society priority.



ABBOTS LEIGH CIVIC SOCIETY CONSTITUTION

Adopted at inaugural meeting held in The Village Hall, Abbots Leigh on 25th September 1979 and amended at the Annual Meeting held on 9th January 2025

NAME:

The name of the Society shall be the Abbots Leigh Civic Society, an unincorporated association.

AIMS

The Society exists to encourage a caring, considerate, sociable and inclusive community for everyone living in the parish of Abbots Leigh by:

- · Cherishing our past present and future
- · Running events for all ages
- · Using any surplus funds for projects which improve the village
- Engendering a sense of community by encouraging people living in Abbots Leigh village to know their neighbours, to welcome new neighbours, to attend the Society's social events and participate in other village groups.

MEMBERSHIP:

Membership shall be open to everyone who lives in the parish of Abbots Leigh.

COMMITTEE & OFFICERS:

The Committee shall appoint a Chair(s) and Treasurer. Members of the Committee will be elected and appointed by the members of the Society at an Annual January Meeting.

POWERS

The Committee shall have the following powers:

- · To open and maintain bank accounts
- · To work with the Parish Council and local organisations/ businesses to achieve its aims
- To support other village groups

RESPONSIBILITIES: The Committee shall:

- · Keep proper financial records
- Issue an Annual Report available on ALCS Website
- . The CS will organise and run two events per year:
 - The Festival in the Field a Summer event held in June/July
 - The Bonfire Night November 5th
- · The Committee will only meet seven times per year -
 - Once in January Annual Committee meeting from which annual report will be produced
 - Once 2 months before each event planning of event + Required insurance and licences
 - Once 2 weeks before each event ensure everything is in place + final planning
 - Once 1 week after each event debrief of event, lessons learnt
